In addition, the Mission is preparing for its 250th Anniversary which is in September 2021.

La Fiesta de San Gabriel History

Celebrations of the founding of the Mission have taken place since 1771 when the Mission was founded by the Fr. Junipero Serra and his helpers, Fathers Angel Fernandez de Somera and Pedro Benito Cambon. They continued through vibrant and flourishing times as well as more challenging days. From 1834 to 1862, the Mission celebrated Fiestas as a secular establishment. Then, in 1862, a grand Fiesta was held to celebrate the return of the San Gabriel Mission to the Catholic Church by President Abraham Lincoln. The Fiesta is a celebration of the anniversary date of our founding, the 8th of September 1771. In 1781, from the Mission,

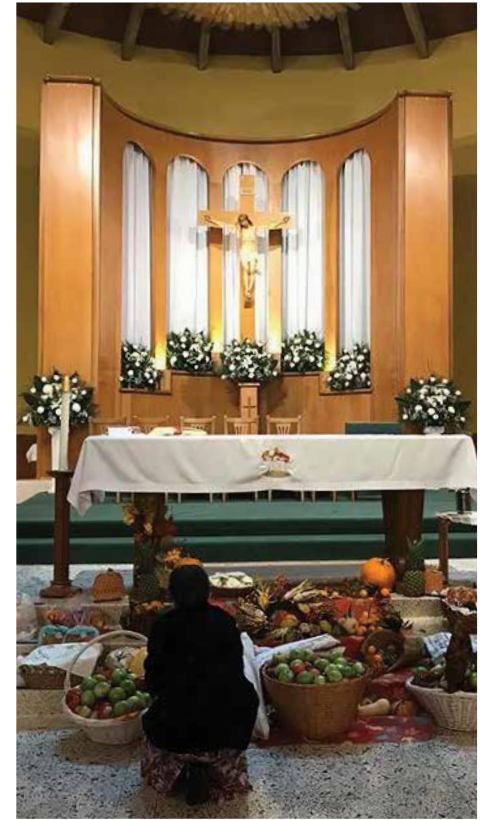
a group of families and settlers headed 10 miles to the west to establish the great city of Los Angeles. That is why San Gabriel is known as the birthplace of the Los Angeles Region.

The modern-day Fiesta, formally known as La Fiesta de San Gabriel, started at the turn of the century around 1903. Celebrations have been held at various times from Thursday to Monday over Labor Day Weekend. Parades were held in the streets of San Gabriel for the Fiesta until the 1970s. A Royal Court consisting of a queen and at least two princesses are selected to reign over the festivities. The Royal Court is part of the Fiesta's long history. Having a queen and in later years, princesses, began 85 years ago in 1934, when the San Gabriel Mission chose Beatrice Salazar, as their first Fiesta Queen at the age of 20. The parishioners sought out someone extraordinary who would serve as a role model for others to emulate. Beatrice embodied everything parishioners wanted in a Queen. She was talented, kind, and always giving of herself to others. The Fiesta has celebrated many milestone events in the 20th Century including the arrival of the Claretian Missionaries in 1908, establishment of Mission Elementary School by the Dominican Sisters in 1912, founding of Mission High School by the Claretian Missionaries and Dominican Sisters in 1949, and the completion of the full restoration of the Mission and Museum in 1993 (due to the 1987 Whittier Narrows Earthquake). In the late 1900s and now, La Fiesta is celebrated on Friday, Saturday, and Sunday of Labor Day Weekend. Cultural, historic, and religious festivities coupled with live entertainment, a variety of international foods, amusements, and games make up our Fiesta. Attendance has continued to rise over the decades, and over 25,000 people

attended La Fiesta in 2019. In this year of 2020, the Mission is celebrating the Fiesta without the traditional weekend Festival because of safety concerns about COVID-19 and the corona virus. They are celebrating with a fundraising raffle, sponsorships, and fundraisers to help the Mission and its Schools get through these challenging times. Fiesta 2020 is a "Bridge to the 250th Anniversary" which they look forward to celebrating in 2021.



For this year, the Mission is continuing some of its Fiesta events such as hosting the Major Awards Raffle, publishing an electronic Fiesta Souvenir Book, and seeking sponsorships. Owing to the serious economic impact from COVID-19 on the Mission, it is even more important to continue fundraising to replace the loss of income they have experienced. The Mission invites the community to support its fundraising raffle which includes a \$10,000 grand prize. The raffle began in August, and it runs through the first week of December, and

Los Angeles County Assessment Appeals Board Goes Virtual

LOS ANGELES - In an effort to provide Los Angeles County residents a convenient, secure and efficient way to continue to attend assessment appeals hearings during the COVID pandemic, the Los Angeles County Assessment Appeals Board has gone virtual and is now providing services online.

On October 19, the Assessment Appeals Board kicked off its first virtual hearing comprised of a web conferencing platform and an online document management portal where residents were able to electronically submit and upload hearing evidence prior to the hearing date. The new virtual hearing process allows the applicant, the Assessor and Board Members to simultaneously view the hearing evidence presented live.

"Transitioning to a virtual platform aligns with the Executive Office's mission to deliver first-class customer service utilizing new technologies to support the Board of Supervisors in serving our constituents," said Jennifer Tran, acting Deputy Executive Officer of the Assessment Appeals division.

On August 4, Fourth District Supervisor Janice Hahn presented a motion to the Board and asked the Executive Office to explore how to modernize current systems to augment in-person hearings by implementing virtual Assessment Appeals Board hearings using video conferencing technology.

"The County is adapting during this pandemic and the Assessment Appeals Board hearings are the latest aspect of County business to go virtual. Holding these hearings through secure video conferencing rather than in-person will make sure that taxpayers can have their appeals heard safely," said Hahn.

In addition to having the meetings held online, the public is now also able to listen in and stay up-to-date through a dial-in phone number and access code, which will be posted before every hearing on the Assessment Appeals Board website.

"During these unprecedented times, serving the public in an effective and efficient way is key," said Celia Zavala, Executive Officer. "By remaining adaptable, we can continue to provide safety net services and due process that are essential to our residents during critical times like these."

Residents can now also submit their assessment appeals applications online in addition to mailing them in. After the validation process, the application gets scheduled for an appeal hearing before the Assessment Appeals Board or Assessment Hearing Officer. A formal hearing appointment card is mailed to the applicant at least 45 days prior to the hearing date. In addition, an email notification with login information is emailed to the hearing participants.

COVID-19 Safety Compliance Certification Program

LA County is helping train businesses on the implementation of COVID-19 safety protocols through a no-cost online training course called the COVID-19 Safety Compliance Certification Program (CSCCP). Once completed, business owners receive a certificate, and window seal to display on their storefront, which can reassure employees and customers alike that the business is following COVID-19 infection control and physical distancing requirements.

Assemblymember Chau Announces New Laws That Take Effect On 2021

MONTEREY PARK – Governor Newsom signed legislation recently, authored by Assemblymember Ed Chau (D–Monterey Park) that will become law effective on January 1, 2021.

"While the uncertainty surrounding the pandemic shifted our focus to work that was most urgent and relevant to the current crisis and also resulted in complications to the legislative process, we still managed to accomplish a great deal this year," said Assemblymember Chau. "Some of my accomplishments include prohibiting the warrantless tracking of individuals by government, resolving conflict-of-interest situations in educational settings, and providing good Samaritans with liability protections when rescuing children trapped in hot cars."

Privacy and Consumer Protection:

Assembly Bill (AB) 904 – Search warrants: tracking devices – Prohibits government entities from using software that permits the tracking of a person or object without a warrant. (Chaptered by Secretary of State – Chapter 63, Statutes of 2020)

AB 1281 – California Consumer Privacy Act of 2018 – Extends by one year the exemptions in the California Consumer Privacy Act of 2018 for business-to-business communications and transactions and the collection of certain personal information by employers until January 1, 2022. (Chaptered by Secretary of State – Chapter 268, Statutes of 2020)

Education:

AB 2234 – School Personnel Commissions Legal Counsel – Provides the personnel commission of a school district, or community college district, the right to retain independent legal counsel when a conflict-of-interest exists between the governing board and the commission. (Chaptered by Secretary of State – Chapter 48, Statutes of 2020)

Public Safety:

AB 2717 – Motor vehicles: unattended children – Exempts from civil and criminal liability Good Samaritans who rescue children, under the age of six, from a vehicle where there is an immediate danger of suffering harm, if certain conditions are met and the Good Samaritan calls emergency services prior to the rescue. (Chaptered by Secretary of State – Chapter 352, Statutes of 2020)

Joint-authored and Co-authored Bills:

AB 1974 (Gray) – Horse racing: welfare and safety of racehorses and jockeys – Makes a number of important changes to the Horse Racing Law to further protect and advance the health, safety, welfare, and aftercare of racehorses in California. These changes include increasing the veterinarian monitoring of injured horses, regulating the administration of medication to horses, and establishing a whistleblower program for people to report questionable activity or concerns relating to the health and safety of humans or horses. (Chaptered by Secretary of State – Chapter 251, Statutes of 2020)

SB 793 (Hill) – Flavored Tobacco Products – prohibits the sale of flavored tobacco products in stores, including flavor enhancers. (Chaptered by Secretary of State - Chapter 34, Statutes of 2020)

Students Return to School in Rosemead School District

On Monday, September 21, 2020, every school in our district welcomed back to school small cohorts of English Learner students to provide specialized services. And, on Monday, October 12, small cohorts of students on an Individualized Education Plan (IEP) returned to school as well. The return of students for in-school support was made possible by the County of Los Angeles Department of Public Health (CLADPH) who on September 2, 2020, updated their Reopening Protocols for K-12 Schools to “permit schools to offer in-school services for small cohorts of students with Individualized Education Plans (IEPs) and children who are English Learners (EL) needing assessments and/or specialized in-school services starting September 14, 2020.”



In order to invite students on campus for assessments and in-school services, we have to ensure that the number of students receiving these services on campus, at any one time, does not exceed 25% of the total student body and that we fully implement the CLADPH Reopening Protocols and COVID-19 Exposure Management Plan. Our amazing Rosemead District Team of teachers and support staff spent several weeks preparing our campuses, adding signage and posters throughout our sites, planning schedules and curriculum, contacting parents, and organizing rooms to welcome back students for whom this will be their first time on and in an American school. Our students were as excited as all of us adults were.



The return of students for in-school support is a first step in what we hope is the start of our return to normal.
