Letter from Hilda L. Solis, Chair of Board of Supervisors

I am honored and humbled to serve, once again, as the Chair of the Board of Supervisors. As Chair of the Board of Supervisors, I intend to lead with courage, urgency, and humility – knowing that there is nothing we cannot do if we do it together.

The Board of Supervisors, our entire County family, the country and the rest of the world all have the same priority: to protect people's physical, mental and financial health by defeating COVID-19.

The COVID-19 pandemic exposed the gaps and structural inequities in our system, it worsened the deep disparities that have existed in our communities for far too long, and it reaffirmed that we cannot go back to the status quo. Message from the Superintendent

Dear Rosemead Community,

We are excited to share that on Monday, November 9, we welcomed back 7 students to our Shuey Full Day Preschool Program. Our Shuey preschool program had been on a rollercoaster ride as we were days away from opening during the summer only to have to cancel those plans as a result of the huge increase in COVID-19 cases in July and August. Our Shuey preschool program serves many children of first responders and essential workers. As such, our parents have been eagerly anticipating the reopening of the program. I would like to thank our amazing Shuey preschool instructional staff for their hard work preparing for our students to return.



Thanks to additional flexibility from our county department of public health, we are now allowed to host up to 25% of a school's total student body for in-school small cohort instructional support. Our teams are in the process of identifying additional students for this support.

At our November 5 Board meeting, our Trustees formally adopted our revised goals for the 2020-2021 school year. You will notice that a new goal was added to address the impact of COVID-19. Our leadership team has begun the work of working with their teams to develop metrics and actions for each of our goals. Below are our 2020-2021 Board Goals:

2020-2021 Board Goals

- Increase student achievement:
 - Close the achievement gap for Hispanic students and Students with Disabilities in English/Language Arts and Math
 - Improve achievement in Mathematics for all students in grades K-8 across the district
- Provide targeted support for schools with the greatest needs to improve student achievement
- Develop and communicate information about exceptional programs in our schools
- Promote fiscal stability by significantly reducing deficit spending
- Begin the strategic planning process to ensure alignment of efforts for continuous improvement throughout the system
- Remediate the impact of COVID-19 as follows:
 - Develop a plan to reverse student learning loss by implementing opportunities for student learning acceleration and a reliable attendance and engagement tracking system
 - Realign our District Professional Development plan to provide additional learning opportunities for staff
 - Identify and secure resources to support the socio-emotional needs of our students and staff
 - Increase the number of students receiving in-school instruction and support in accordance with the county department of health guidelines
 - Implement new school procedures to promote the health and safety of students and staff at all times

2020 BRINGS CHALLENGES AND CHANGE

Dear Friends of Maryvale,

Who would have imagined everything 2020 would bring when we celebrated the New Year! The pandemic, social unrest and wildfires have challenged us all in ways beyond what we sometimes feel we may be able to handle.

As one of the Daughters told me during the time we were making the decision to close the program: "We don't like to celebrate the centennial of anything because, if you have been doing the same thing for 100 years, you're probably doing something wrong!" I'm not sure that's true in every case, but I do agree that it is important to change course when needs change. This is exactly what Maryvale is doing.

In the midst of all this, Maryvale's leadership made the very significant decision to close our Short-Term Residential Therapeutic Program (STRTP), ending 164 years of residential services for children. Following all the changes the State of California implemented to better serve children in foster care, it became clear the program was not working. The outcomes for children, impact on staff and financial drain on the agency all contributed to the ultimate decision to end this chapter in the Maryvale story.

MARYVALE CONTINUES TO SERVE CHILDREN AND FAMILIES

Maryvale remains open and continues to serve children and their families. We are providing critical services through our Early Childhood Education Programs in Rosemead and Duarte, as well as our Community-Based and Wraparound Services Programs.

STRATEGIC PLANNING PROCESS UNDERWAY

We have embarked on a comprehensive strategic planning process and a separate process to look specifically at potential uses for our Rosemead campus and four acres of undeveloped land adjacent to the campus. This is an exciting time to carefully consider the community's needs and how Maryvale can best respond to those needs.

Throughout our 164-year history, transitions like this are common. The Daughters of Charity, who founded Maryvale in 1856, are committed to meeting the needs of the community and having the greatest impact possible. Sometimes this means re-evaluating the services provided and shifting focus.

We are exploring possible housing options, as well as opportunities to expand our Early Education and Community-Based Services Programs. While we don't yet know the path we will take, we are dedicated to writing the next chapter for Maryvale and following the inspiration of the Holy Spirit in continuing our long and rich legacy of service in Los Angeles County.
