Round 2 SBAP is Now Open!

Round 2 of the City's Small Business Assistance Program (SBAP) is now open. The City of Rosemead is providing business assistance to address the adverse repercussion of the novel coronavirus to the economy and to jobs. The City's Small Business Assistance Program will provide grants for the payment of commercial rent to qualified Rosemead businesses undergoing financial hardship as a direct result of COVID-19. Due to limited funding, applications for the SBAP are being accepted on a first come, first served basis. Only complete applications will be reviewed for processing. Before submitting your application, please verify that all requested documents have been uploaded. If you have previously received funding from the City of Rosemead's SBAP, you may not qualify to apply again.

Qualifying micro enterprises with five (full-time equivalent) employees or less are encouraged to apply for assistance. The City will provide a maximum of \$10,000 for commercial rent to be paid directly to the landlord. To be eligible, the business must have been in operation prior to March 1, 2020; have a valid Rosemead Business License; have a verifiable loss of revenue due to COVID-19; and have not received other assistance for the same commercial rent. Diverse Businesses Awarded Over \$884 Million in SoCalGas Contracts in 2020, 42% of Total Spending

LOS ANGELES, Calif., March 8, 2021 – Southern California Gas Co. (SoCalGas) announced today the company achieved another record year of spending with over 550 diverse business enterprises in 2020—at \$884.2 million, the highest in company history. SoCalGas exceeded the California Public Utilities Commission's (CPUC) goal of 21.5% for the 28th consecutive year by procuring nearly 42% of total goods and services from women, minority, service-disabled veteran, and LGBT-owned businesses.

“During these unprecedented times where our world grapples with the COVID-19 pandemic, massive economic challenges and glaring racial inequities, SoCalGas is proud to have worked with over 550 diverse suppliers in 2020,” said Jeff Walker, chief administrative and diversity officer and senior vice president at SoCalGas. “As SoCalGas looks to build the cleanest, safest and most innovative energy company in North America, our diverse suppliers will be a crucial part of our mission and we look forward to continuing our work with these business enterprises for years to come.”

“I commend SoCalGas for their continued commitment to supplier diversity, thus supporting the growth and development of diverse business enterprises,” said California State Senator Steven Bradford (D-Gardena). “Supplier diversity is a critical component of the business environment in California. The late Honorable Gwen Moore worked tirelessly to create focus on this issue, emphasizing the importance of utilizing diverse businesses and helping them to build a sustainable business. SoCalGas is a true leader in this space.”

In addition to spending with diverse enterprises, SoCalGas also invests in the development of these firms. Development opportunities include business assessment programs, entrepreneurship courses, organizational and operation strategy programs, mentorship and technical assistance. The programs are designed to help diverse suppliers enhance their operations

and help ensure success in their business partnerships.

“Things really took off for us when we began providing services for SoCalGas’ Pipeline Integrity Management Program and Pipeline Safety Enhancement Plan and were awarded a master service agreement to provide engineering and surveying services,” said Mary Josenhans, co-founder, president and CEO at WestLAND.

“In 2014, we had 70 employees; now, we have about 100 employees. The increase is almost entirely due to SoCalGas — more than half of our employees are working on the company’s projects,” said Craig Bingham, vice president at Johnson-Peltier.

In 2020, SoCalGas purchases with women-owned businesses were surpassed for the 32nd consecutive year, totaling nearly \$243 million. The company also marked spend with 135 new diverse firms as well as \$192 million in spend with diverse subcontractors. Other 2020 highlights include:

- \$568 million spent with minority-owned businesses (category includes both minority men and women-owned)
- 41.3% total purchases with diverse suppliers
- \$61 million spent with disabled-veteran business enterprises
- 15 firms among the top 25 SoCalGas suppliers are diverse firms
- 92% of suppliers are based in SoCalGas’ home state of California

Senator Susan Rubio’s Bill Aims to Prevent Unaccompanied Women Homelessness

SACRAMENTO, CA –Senator Susan Rubio (D-Baldwin Park) introduced a bill that would be the first nationally to recognize unaccompanied women who are experiencing homelessness as a distinct population in order to target resources to help them.

Senate Bill 678 – the Unaccompanied Women Experiencing Homelessness Act of 2021 – would make California the first state in the nation to recognize unaccompanied women experiencing homelessness without children or dependents as a distinct homeless subpopulation. The bill would require the Homeless Coordinating and Financing Council to collect data about this subpopulation in accordance with state and federal privacy and confidentiality laws, and include that data in the state’s Homeless Data Integration System in order to improve the state’s ability to design programs and strategies to address their specific needs.

“Women who are on their own and experiencing homelessness are too often forgotten, and there is a lack of specific programs to serve their needs,” Sen. Rubio said. “Despite making up nearly one-third of homeless adults nationwide, no state, including California, classifies unaccompanied women as a distinct group. Many of these women are dealing with trauma, including domestic violence and sexual assault, which contributed to their situation. The first step to solving our state’s

homeless problem is having accurate data about who is unhoused and what their needs are, and I’m proud to author this bill to accomplish that.”

“Senator Rubio has been a tireless champion for domestic violence survivors and the needs of women in Sacramento, and we applaud her for authoring this bill,” said Amy Turk, CEO of the Downtown Women’s Center, the first provider of permanent supportive housing for women in the country. “As a leader for advocating on behalf of the needs of unhoused women, Downtown Women’s Center know that the data, recommendations, and measurable goals that result from this legislation will uplift the voices of unaccompanied women, which have previously gone unheard.”

“The first step in solving any problem is to understand it. And we can only understand the challenges unaccompanied women experiencing homelessness face if we have the data,” said Los Angeles City Councilmember Mark Ridley-Thomas. “I applaud this critical legislation because we are in the midst of an urgent crisis – according to the 2020 Greater Los Angeles Homeless Count, there are more than 21,000 women experiencing homelessness in LA County. This bill will help to shine a light on their needs and allow us to support them with more funding and services.”

Chair Hilda L. Solis' Statement on the One Year Anniversary of the Safer at Home Order

Los Angeles, CA – Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors Chair Hilda L. Solis, Supervisor to the First District, issued the following statement in remembrance of the one year anniversary since the Safer at Home order was instituted in response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

“A year ago, there was no such thing as a red or purple tier, nor were there COVID vaccine mega PODs, and yet now these topics are part of our everyday conversations. Today we mark one full year since the first Los Angeles County Health Officer Order instructed us to Stay Safer at Home. We have sacrificed so much to save our family members and our neighbors, and we have mourned the loss of people who have fallen to COVID. Yet, despite what we have gone through this past year, we are now entering a new era of hope. Because of all we have done to keep one another safe, staying home, limiting our interactions with others, wearing our masks, and following the Health Officer Order whenever possible, we are finally beginning to see the easing of restrictions

and a decreasing death toll from the world’s deadliest virus. Not only are we now in the red tier, but we have three incredibly effective vaccines already received by millions of people. These events seemed almost unimaginable only a few months ago, but, what seemed like distant dreams have now become inspiring realities.

The worst phase of this crisis seems to be behind us. Our children are beginning to go back to the classroom, our economy is slowly recovering, and we are vaccinating tens of thousands of people each day across the county.

Our county’s recovery will not happen overnight. Our key to beating this pandemic once and for all lies within these vaccinations, which is why I am doing everything in my power to bring vaccines where we need them most: to our hardest hit neighborhoods, to all our abuelitas and tios, to our essential workers, and to teachers and those with disabilities.

Together we will get to the finish line, leaving COVID-19 far behind.”

Message from the Superintendent

Greetings Rosemead Community,

We are happy to share that COVID-19 case rates for Los Angeles County have dropped below the threshold which would allow students in Grades TK-8 to return to in-person learning. In response to our ability to reopen for Hybrid Learning, our Board of Trustees voted to approve the following dates for the return to in-person instruction.

*Students of families that selected Distance Learning will attend school remotely Monday through Friday at home.

Please be aware that an increase in COVID rates or action by the Legislature or Governor could cause adjustments to our reopening timeline.

Reopening Details: Please view our district's [Reopening of School Framework](#) for specific details about the Hybrid Learning Model schedule and safety protocols.

Important Communication: Families with children in grades TK-8 will receive communication directly from your school/s regarding your assigned cohort. You will be asked to verify your preference. Please note that in-person attendance is not mandatory. We will continue to support students and families who choose to remain in Distance Learning through the end of the school year.

Childcare: Childcare is available for families enrolled in the Hybrid Learning Model through our ASES/ASART program. Please contact Deborah Lawrence at (626) 312-2900 x258, dlawrence@rosemead.k12.ca.us, or Bella Galvan at (626) 312-2900 x235, bgalvan@rosemead.k12.ca.us for more information.

Next Steps: All families will receive communication very soon directly from their school site/s with important information regarding daily schedules and safety expectations.

Herald Christian Health Center Initiative Towards COVID-19 Vaccine Distribution

To ensure equitable access to COVID-19 vaccinations for community members, the Herald Christian Health Center (HCHC) has launched community-based COVID-19 vaccination centers at select locations across the San Gabriel Valley. On Monday, March 15, 2021, from 2:00 p.m. – 2:45 p.m., the City of San Gabriel will host a press conference at the San Gabriel Mission Playhouse (320 W. Mission Drive) to highlight HCHC's efforts to secure COVID-19 vaccinations for members of our communities. HCHC, Los Angeles County officials, and city elected officials will discuss the vaccination hubs that will develop across the West San Gabriel Valley to serve seniors, teachers, and essential workers. HCHC has also opened the eligibility list to grocery store, restaurant, and other food service employees.

HCHC and the City of Rosemead will work together to reach community members eligible for a vaccine that cannot otherwise schedule appointments via the County of Los Angeles Department of Public Health. We are tentatively scheduled to begin vaccinations on Tuesday, March 23, 2021, and will operate weekly on Tuesdays and Thursdays, from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., in the Rosemead Community Recreation Center (RCRC). HCHC will occupy four rooms inside RCRC, which is currently closed for

public use. Vaccinations will be administered by appointment only for about six weeks, with approximately 600 vaccinations per day. City staff will work with HCHC to help register seniors that participate in our weekly lunch distribution program at the Garvey Community Center.

"Ensuring equitable access to the COVID-19 vaccine is critically important for our efforts to combat this global public health crisis," said Los Angeles County Supervisor Kathryn Barger. "It is a privilege to join with Herald Christian Health Center and local leaders in the community to support ample distribution of COVID-19 vaccine supply to help our residents stay safe and return to a sense of normalcy."

"The City is thankful for the opportunity to partner with HCHC to provide the vaccine to our residents. The COVID-19 pandemic has greatly impacted Rosemead, and this is a great opportunity for our residents to be vaccinated," said Rosemead Mayor Sandra Armenta.
